Current Project #604 - "Bread of Life" Bakery Project (Ukraine)



We received these photos from **Mission Eurasia** (formerly Russian Ministries) which recently opened its **first bakery** in the town of Marinka, Ukraine! This bakery provides jobs, economic growth, food, and most importantly opportunities to share the Gospel. There are plans to open additional "Bread of Life" bakeries in four different

Eastern Ukrainian cities this year.



The conflict in Ukraine continues to rage throughout the Eastern half of the

country and has affected over 3.1 million people. Many have become dependent on humanitarian aid to survive. Through Mission Eurasia's "I Care" Refugee Assistance Program, Christian churches have distributed thousands of food packs, clothes, Scripture, and other goods in various cities where the situation is most critical.

MODERN EQUIPMENT MAKES A MORE EFFICIENT MISSIONARY

Dental Caravans Serve Amazon Jungle Communities

PROJECT #591: Ecuador



"We can barely express how grateful we are for the gift that we received in August 2015 which was used to purchase a portable dental unit and generator. We are on the edge of the Ecuadorian jungle. The country-side looks so tranquil but the stories of the children here are far from peaceful. They come

from sad situations—broken families and abusive homes." - Reach Beyond

Four years ago, a shelter was opened where at-risk children and their families could be brought for safety. Dr. Theresa and the **Reach Beyond Dental Caravan** came to this shelter last year. **Dr. Teresa** is an **Ecuadorian dentist** who has a heart to serve the people of her country. Many cavities were filled, a few teeth extracted, and recommendations for further care were made. **The smiles were bright on the kids' faces** after they had their teeth thoroughly cleaned!

A trip into two Waorani (Auca) communities made it clear how needed this dental equipment was! Dr. Teresa worked late into the night in order to see each person. The medical staff said she had tears in her eyes because she wanted to do more but had to move on to the next community. **What a difference this portable dental unit has made!**

The Gospel is also shared in every village. Teams prayed with patients whenever possible and reported that ten people accepted Christ as Savior in one village alone during the caravan's visit.



Reach Beyond wants to thank you, our donors, on behalf of their dental caravan team who traveled to over **30 villages** in Ecuador in 2015, and also on behalf of Ecuadorian believers traveling with them to serve as dentists.

Most of all, they thank you on behalf of the thousands of patients who live in communities inaccessible by road but who are now **able to receive dental treatment** because of this new equipment!

Huge Encouragement to Ukrainian Christians!

PROJECT #593: Ukraine

The growing church in Ukraine is beginning to send workers to the North Caucasus Mountains and Central Asia regions. There are at least **43 different language groups** in these areas, which makes a Print-on-Demand (POD) system necessary for publishing Christian literature.

MPF completed this project for **Avant Ministries** last year for a **Laminator Foliant Gemini**, which was the final piece of machinery needed to complete the POD printing process.

This project will bring the Ukrainian church full-circle—from being the recipient of Christian literature, to being the

provider of **Christian literature**, both for themselves and empowering the Ukrainian missionary movement to offer Christian literature to minority people groups!

MISSION EURASIA (formerly: Russian Ministries)

COST: \$ 9,949

The "I Care" Refugee Assistance Program meets the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of those suffering from the war in Ukraine. The "Bread of Life" Bakery Project will make it possible to reach as many as 100,000 needy people in just one year. Each family receiving a loaf of bread will also receive a Bible.

Equipment needed for one bakery:

1 -baking oven 1 -dough proofer 1 -dough mixer with vat
1 -flour sifter 4 -carts for baking forms 25 -forms for bread.



605 -Ecuador

REACH BEYOND

COST: \$ 10,000

Reach Beyond (formerly HCJB radio) has been proclaiming the Good News from Quito, Ecuador, for almost 85 years. Their FM transmissions currently cover an audience of 2.5 million people with a potential for 4.5 million. Their current equipment is over 20 years old and has gone beyond its life expectancy. One of the receivers failed late last year and their other equipment is old and will not last much longer. Replacement is urgently needed! They need four different components for a Studio-Transmitter Link Replacement.

CHRISTIAN WORLD OUTREACH

COST: \$ 12,400

CWO helps people in developing countries improve their quality of life by reaching out to those who are shunned and forgotten. In Zambia, this help includes evangelism and outreach work, HIV/AIDS education, and the management of a learning library. The CWO staff in Zambia is in need of a reliable vehicle for the rough terrain and many miles they travel in their work. The **2006 Toyota Hilux** is a very reliable vehicle, both durable and easy to maintain.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATING MINISTRIES

COST: \$ 10,000

ICM equips and disciples indigenous congregations to reach their communities for Christ. Their Mini Bible College (MBC) materials have been distributed worldwide in over 40 languages. ICM now has a unique opportunity to reach Syrian refugees with the Gospel. The discreet, portable design of the audio unit allows people to study the MBC curriculum in their own homes or in small groups. This project will provide **200 units of the MBC audio players** to a specific country in the Middle East at a cost of only \$50 per unit.

609 -Sierra Leone

CLC MINISTRIES, INT'L

COST: \$ 8,150

With increased demand for Christian literature in Sierra Leone, CLC Ministries endeavors to meet this need. Many factors make it difficult and expensive to ship books overseas; therefore, to meet the need, CLC is planning to provide their national director in Sierra Leone with a **Publish4All Print-on-Demand (POD)** system enabling them to produce biblical materials anytime—anywhere; and to share these resources with other Christian ministries.

Equipment Needs: computer, cutter, binder, three printers, two wide-format printers, and a power package
