REACH BEYOND

Current Project #605 Studio-Transmitter-Link Replacement (Ecuador)



On December 25, 1931, **Reach Beyond** (then called HCJB World Radio) began Radio HCJB in Quito, Ecuador, thus becoming the **first missionary radio station** in the world.



A radio ministry is made up of many parts. One part is the producers who create the programs but an equally important part is properly functioning equipment that allows those programs to reach individuals. **Studio-Transmitter-Link (STL) equipment** allows the various transmitter sites to receive reliable signals from the studio, letting listeners hear consistent programming on Radio HCJB.



Radio is an effective means of reaching people with the Word of God and discipling those in isolated areas who are without access to good biblical teaching or fellowship. For more information on this project and to **learn how you can help**, see page three of this newsletter.

Bringing Good News to the Blind

PROJECT #595: Worldwide

For over 60 years, **Source of Light Ministries (SLM)** has published, printed, and distributed Bible study courses throughout the world.



In 2009, another Christian ministry joined with SLM to launch **Source of Light Braille Ministries** with the goal of providing braille Bible study courses and other materials to the blind population. Did you know that there are thousands of braille readers in the United States and **millions more** around the world? Too often these people are isolated, unemployed, and under-schooled. SLM provides biblical training to blind Christians and equips them to reach out and train others. SLM Braille Ministries currently ministers in nine countries, but there are **many more waiting** to receive this type of Christian literature.

Last year we were asked by Source of Light to help fund

two new braille embossers to meet the ever-increasing need for Christian literature in braille form. This project was recently completed and the new embossers were set up this past spring! (see photo on right)

Source of Light now has the ability to print more devotionals (such as Our Daily Bread), Sunday School lessons, hymnals, and SLM outreach/discipleship materials in braille and will be able to expand their reach into even more countries!

PROJECT #599: Kenya

“Chariots for Hope exists to honor God by loving, nurturing, and providing for vulnerable and orphaned children in Kenya.”



Chariots for Hope operates ten homes in Kenya for children and babies. The **Mahiga Children’s Home**, which currently shelters over 90 children, is located several hours north of Nairobi, Kenya. Each home provides holistic care to the children along with hope and opportunity for their future. At the heart of this care is introducing them to Jesus and raising them in a Christ-centered environment.

Visitors play an important role in the daily operation of each home by volunteering their time and talents helping with maintenance needs. They also encourage and mentor the local staff by providing training in various areas, and they help care for the children’s daily needs.

A modest **Guest House** was recently completed on the Mahiga campus through funds provided by MPF. Before it was built, visitors needed to travel a great distance to find suitable housing during their stay. This greatly reduced the amount of time they spent working at the home. Now volunteer teams can spend **more time giving** and less time traveling!

#604 -Ukraine

MISSION EURASIA

COST: \$ 9,949

The "I Care" Refugee Assistance Program meets the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of those suffering from the war in Ukraine. The "Bread of Life" Bakery Project will make it possible to reach as many as 100,000 needy people in just one year. Each family who receives a loaf of bread will also receive a copy of Scripture. In addition, local residents will be hired to bake the bread and run the bakery. Equipment needs are:



REACH BEYOND

COST: \$ 10,000

Reach Beyond (formerly HCJB Radio) has been proclaiming the Good News from Quito, Ecuador, for almost 85 years. Their FM transmissions now cover an audience of 2.5 million people with a potential for 4.5 million. Their current equipment is over 20 years old and has started failing. They urgently need four different components for a **Studio-Transmitter Link Replacement**.

CHRISTIAN WORLD OUTREACH

COST: \$ 12,400

2016 Banquet Project - Christian World Outreach helps people in developing countries improve their quality of life by reaching out to the shunned and forgotten. In Zambia, this help consists of evangelism and outreach work, HIV/AIDS education, and oversight of a learning library. The CWO staff is in need of a reliable vehicle for the rough terrain and many miles they travel in their work. The **2006 Toyota Hilux** is a very reliable vehicle, both durable and easy to maintain.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATING MINISTRIES

COST: \$ 10,000

ICM equips and disciples indigenous congregations to reach their communities for Christ. Their *Mini Bible College* (MBC) materials have been distributed worldwide in over 40 languages. ICM now has a unique opportunity to reach Syrian refugees with the Gospel. The discreet, portable design of the audio unit allows people to study the MBC curriculum in their own homes or in small groups. This project will provide **200 units of the MBC audio players** to a specific country in the Middle East at a cost of only \$50 per unit.

#609 -Sierra Leone

CLC MINISTRIES, INT'L

COST: \$ 8,150

CLC Ministries endeavors to meet increased demand for Christian literature in Sierra Leone. Many factors make it difficult and expensive to ship books overseas; therefore, to meet the need, CLC is planning to provide their national director with a **Publish4All Print-on-Demand** (POD) system. This will enable them to produce biblical materials anytime—anywhere; and to share these resources with other Christian ministries. Equipment Needs: computer, cutter, binder, three printers, two wide-format printers, and a power package.

Streams of Living Water works through the ministry of Pioneers to provide support and administration for several training schools in North Africa. They are the first missionary school in the region whose goal is to equip indigenous pastors to evangelize and disciple unreached people groups in North Africa and the Middle East. One of these schools instructs Sudanese pastors in the Word, teaching and equipping them to "Go and make disciples..." They are in need of **two desktop computers, one laptop, and one printer** for their school office.
