Rescuing and caring for abandoned and neglected children



The country of **Nicaragua** has experienced a history of corrupt dictatorships, political conflicts, and natural disasters. According to ORPHANetwork's website, 53% of the six million people who live in this country are age 18 or younger, with abject poverty affecting the lives of women and children the most. But there is hope and a brighter future for the people of Nicaragua!

For over 17 years, our newest ministry partner, **ORPHANetwork**, has been working in Nicaragua to rescue children and create opportunities for a better future. They work primarily through **local churches** in that country who share their vision and values. These churches either operate orphanages or are in some way making a positive impact in their community. The heart of their ministry is to walk alongside Nicaraguans and encourage them by providing resources, consultations, professional help, and more. They believe it is ultimately Nicaraguans who must solve the problems of Nicaragua.

Child Protection Centers (orphanage homes) & the Transition Program -

ORPHANetwork partners with six **child protection centers** who serve a total of 360 rescued children. These centers provide safety and love as they work with each child to reach their God-given potential. As the children turn 18, or graduate from school, they are further supported through the **Transition Program** until they either find a job or continue their education.

Local Church Initiatives -

There are more than 200 Local Church Initiative (LCI) partners across Nicaragua who work to improve the quality of life for **20,000 vulnerable children** living in garbage dumps, refugee camps, and poor communities. Their model for breaking the cycle of poverty is put into action through these three different platforms:

- **Health:** Providing nourishing meals, deworming pills, and routine medical care
- **Education:** Serving 500 children in ten after-school education programs
- **Jobs:** Providing vocational job training so that young people can compete for jobs in the welding, construction, manufacturing, and tourism industries

Burkina Faso: Mobile Medical Clinic

UPDATE ON PROJECT #573 - CHRISTIAN WORLD OUTREACH (CWO)

Christian World Outreach began its **Mobile Medical Ministry** nearly 20 years ago, bringing basic medical care to small villages where people have little to no access to healthcare and where many die unnecessarily from treatable diseases.

CWO partners with small village churches to provide people with the chance to receive medical care, food (when possible), and an opportunity to hear the Gospel.

About five years ago, we funded a project to provide a **used engine** for their **mobile medical clinic van**. With a dynamic team of volunteer evangelists and medical personnel, this ministry is still making a difference in Burkina Faso today!

The Mobile Clinic typically provides care for approximately **125 people each month**. In addition to vaccinations and care for routine ailments, they can also detect more serious illnesses that require care at a hospital. The volunteers give out Bibles, sing songs together, and put on puppet shows to share God's Word with their patients!


Over the years, MPF has partnered with UIM on several important aviation projects—this most recent one was for various **support tools and equipment**. Each tool requested in this project was used to maintain the aircraft and facilities and also

supported the pilots and maintenance crew to enhance proficiency and safety.

Below is a short list of some of the equipment that was purchased using our grant money:

- Cargo Nets
- Aerosock Windsocks
- LED Taxi/Landing Lights
- Husky Air Compressor
- CDI Torque Wrench
- And more...!

Survival gear such as **machetes and a collapsible shovel** (see photos below) were also provided. These are kept in the aircraft at all times in case of an emergency.

649 CHARIOTS FOR HOPE - KENYA

Project Cost: \$ 9,783

The Mogogosiek Baby Home is one of eight homes in the Chariots For Hope network. Staff members, who are all Kenyan nationals, serve the youngest and most vulnerable children. Most of the staff are young women who share living quarters, but Chariots is hoping to build **separate living accommodations** on campus for their Assistant Manager and her family. Having a place on campus is essential to ensure she is available when urgent situations arise. www.chariotsforhope.org

650 ORPHANETWORK - NICARAGUA

Project Cost: \$ 2,692

This ministry rescues abandoned, abused, and orphaned children and creates opportunities for new life while sharing Christ. They partner with local churches who work with the poorest of the poor, some living on the outskirts of garbage dumps. One of the churches is in need of **several pieces of equipment** to improve their facilities as they minister to vulnerable children. www.orphanetwork.org

651 REFUGE FOR THE POOR - CAMBODIA

Project Cost: \$ 4,963

"Outfitting the Refuge Center" - Refuge for the Poor evangelizes and disciples poor, vulnerable, and at-risk children, teens, and young adults through their newest outreach ministry, **The Refuge Center**, which is located just outside of Phnom Penh. The kids who live there are given what they need to thrive while being trained as leaders to teach God's Word to other children and teens. This is a new outreach and they are in need of a variety of equipment to get them started. www.refugeforthe poor.org

652 CHRISTIAN WORLD OUTREACH - BURKINA FASO

Project Cost: \$ 3,500


CWO operates a vocational training center in Burkina for young women called the **Village of Opportunity (VOO)**. To help the school become more self-sufficient, they began a "Chicken and Farm Project" where baby chicks are bought and raised and their eggs are used to help feed the students. They also plant, cultivate, and harvest crops, some to feed the students and some to sell. They need a **tricycle moped** to haul large items such as feed, crops, supplies and more. www.cwomissions.org



653 AFRICAN CHILDREN'S MISSION - UGANDA

Project Cost: \$ 10,000

African Children's Mission (ACM) reaches children living in destitute conditions in Uganda through child sponsorships, school feeding programs, clean water projects, and more. They need a **truck** to replace the old one at their headquarters, which is located on a dirt road many miles from the nearest paved highway. It is used to transport sick and injured children to hospitals, deliver food to schools, transport supplies and VBS materials to the communities, and much more.

654 CEF MINISTRIES - BELIZE

Project Cost: \$ 1,812

CEF-Belize partners with local churches to go into neighboring communities and share the Gospel with children through Good News Clubs. Last year they brought on two new staff members to help with this effort. Their national office has almost no furnishings or equipment to conduct trainings and provide materials for their teachers. They are in need of several pieces of equipment to reach 15,000 children this year: **12-inch Laminator \$124; Video Projector \$763; and Photocopier \$925**

655 BOLD HOPE (FORMERLY: POVERTY RESOLUTIONS) - HAITI

Project Cost: \$14,500

Since it costs money to attend school in Haiti, many disadvantaged children are unable to afford the enrollment fee. Bold Hope wishes to break the cycle of poverty by offering a quality Christian education at minimal cost through their Child Development Program. They currently offer education for Pre-K through 2nd grade, but because of the vast need, they are adding 3rd and 4th grade this coming school year and need help obtaining the proper equipment and curriculum for the new classrooms. <https://boldhope.org/>

656 CHRISTIAN MISSION FOR THE DEAF - NIGERIA

Project Cost: \$ 4,500

This ministry is committed to liberating deaf people from the bondage of illiteracy, poverty, joblessness, and their damaging effects. In addition to a school, they have over 29 deaf churches spread throughout Nigeria. They need the funds to purchase **120 strong metal double-seat school desks** for their deaf school in Ibadan, Nigeria. The ones they are using now are quite old and not very sturdy for the children (see photo far right).

657 INT'L COOPERATING MINISTRIES - SOUTH AFRICA

Project Cost: \$ 10,000

Christians in Africa are in dire need of Bibles and discipleship materials in their heart language. There is an estimated 200,000 untrained Christian pastors in South Africa alone, many who are poorly equipped to teach and have no depth of biblical knowledge. Often these untrained pastors take misguided approaches to the gospel.

ICM has teamed up with *Judea Harvest* to equip and train pastors by giving them a two-week training course, including instructions on using audio-players loaded with the Mini Bible College (MBC), a four-year survey of the Bible. The pastors then return to their own communities where they are expected to train 15 other pastors and lay leaders. They are asking for **484 solar-powered devices** (\$20.67 per device).
